
A Recap of the K.A.R.C. Survey 2022

In the summer of 2022, the KARC board conducted a survey to better define member demographics and interests concerning amateur radio. The survey was completed on paper during a KARC meeting or online. Members received e-mail follow up to encourage participation. There were 40 respondents to the survey however not all respondents answered all questions. A club membership list provided names and emails of current and inactive ham radio members.

Demographics

License class and years of experience were the first questions. There were 16 Amateur Extra/Advanced members, 17 General and 6 Technician licensed respondents. This was a similar distribution to membership lists with the exception of Technician members responding to the survey in lower numbers than the other license levels.




Duration of license was the next question. Amateur Extras were either 1-5 year experience or 20-30 years experience with three members with >5 and <20 years. General license holders had similar distributions. Technician level respondents were all 1-5 years of experience.






How Long have you been licensed 40 responses




There were two questions on Bands and responses had a wide spectrum of the bands being used by members. The 70cm and 2m bands were the most commonly used. The 20m and 40m bands were also popular.

There were questions on areas of interest and potential topics for meeting presentations. Kit/antenna building was the most popular topic for a meeting but there were diverse interests in meeting topics. (See next page for graphic)

Lastly there were questions about developing a Mentor or Elmer program in the club. Potential Elmers listed topics that they felt that they would be able to help others with. Newer club members seeking mentorship had a chance to request topics of interest to themselves.

Conclusions:

- Demographics: The Club has lots of experienced hams but also consists of many new to the hobby. We need to endeavor to expand Technician Class community members' involvement and further develop their skills. The club should also work to encourage participation and club membership to the many hams in the Kalamazoo area that are not currently active.
- 2. We will seek presenters for topics of interest so the club remains relevant to members and continues to be a learning environment.
- 3. K.A.R.C. will work to establish Mentor/ELMER teams to assist newer members with ham radio based on their interests.
